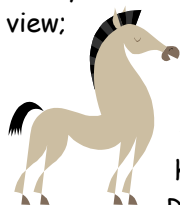

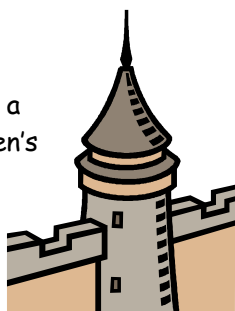
Favourite views

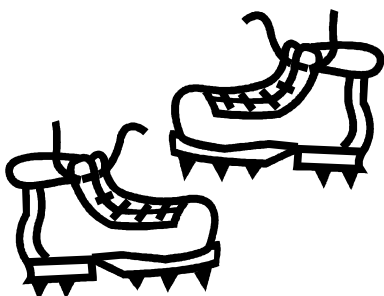
School Football Team
