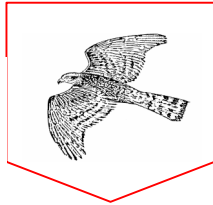

Dear Parents / Carers,

I can't believe we are at the end of another half term already! Although I think staff and children would agree with me that we are all ready for a holiday, and contrary to the popular myth the 'holiday' will probably include teachers doing at least one days work during their 'holidays' so don't let the children moan too much about having to do homework over the break!!

We are planning ahead for next half term already. Mr O'Brien, Miss Clancy and Miss Milborrow have set dates in the diary for running some more Parent Workshops to give you the opportunity to find out more about what we do at school, and how you can help to improve your child's learning. It's looking like it will be an exciting day – the children will have an assembly about food waste, have their photographs taken from above, and individual photographs, and will be learning all about food waste throughout the day. Please ask them on Friday afternoon what they enjoyed the most, and what they have learnt from the day.

Development day reminder

If you would like to send your son / daughter to our 'After School Club' on that Monday please either contact Mrs Crook (01303-892224) or Cindy on 079099 35 821.

The cost of the club is £19 for the full day (8am –6pm) and £9.50 for either a morning (8am –1pm) or an afternoon (1pm – 6pm).

Money saving tip-

If you're pregnant, the baby's due date is on or after 6 April 2009 and you're at least 25 weeks pregnant you're entitled to a £190 one-off, tax free payment from the government. The grant isn't means-tested and comes in addition to any benefits or tax credits you get, including the Sure Start Maternity Grant, so if you're eligible make sure you apply.

The Health in Pregnancy Grant (HipG) is aimed at doing exactly what it says on the tin, keeping you fit and healthy in the last trimester of your pregnancy.

Who's eligible?

You can get the grant if all of the following apply:

- you are 25 weeks pregnant or more
- your expected date of delivery is on or after 6 April 2009
- you have been given health advice from a midwife or doctor

How do you apply?

To get it you need to ask your midwife or doctor for the Health in Pregnancy Grant form, or phone the HipG Helpline on 0292 350 1178.
