Dear Parents,

This week I have been visiting classrooms to see how children are getting on in their Guided Reading lessons. At school we teach reading every day, for 25-30 minutes as a discrete lesson. We know that teaching reading is more than just listening to children read (although that is obviously part of it) but also helping children to read new works and asking children questions about what they have just read. In the Guided Reading lessons the teacher works with a key group of 6 children (a different group each day) and the Teaching Assistant also works with a group of children. The other children are either completing Reading journal activities (which could be a book review / answering questions about the text etc) listening to a story on a CD, or reading a book of their own choice (often linked to their theme or the author their class is named after. I am pleased to be able to report back that all the sessions I have visited this week and last have been super! I thought some parents may like to have a list of questions that they can ask their son / daughter when they listen to them read at home. Each week on the back of the newsletter I will include some that you can use as a bank of helpful questions.

We really believe that we want children to love reading, and love books. Yesterday we had a 'story swap' in school. This means that there is a whole school story-time, but the class are read a story by another teacher in the school. The teacher will share one of their favourite books with another class. The children enjoy a story from someone different, and the teachers like to go and visit previous classes they have taught. Ask your son / daughter this weekend who came to read to them!

Mr Rogers is busy updating the school website, and it will be ready to 'go live' towards the end of next week. I am really pleased with the previews I have seen! I will update you further next week.

Thank you to all the people who participated in Jeans for Genes day today. It is a charity the school has supported for years. I am very proud to say that this year we have raised £315.70 for such a worthy charity. I know that the children love coming into school in their own clothes for a change (and teachers like to wear their jeans!)

Places will get booked up quickly so please do call Di on 079 09 935 821


Useful questions to ask your child when you listen to them read at home

Remember it is important that children enjoy reading so don't make this a chore, but getting children to answer these questions will enhance their reading ability.

Use these questions before starting to read the book....

- What is the title?
- Why do you think the author has chosen this title?
- What are the names of the main characters?
.....and these ones afterwards / at the end of a chapter
- What is the main event in the story?
- What do you think will happen next?
- What sort of person is.....?

Let me know how these go when you see me in the mornings, and whether they are useful. More questions next week!
