Dear Parents,

We have had 2 confirmed and 1 possible case of scarlet Fever in school this week. The infection is highly contagious and the bacteria are carried in saliva and mucus, meaning it can be spread by sneezing, coughing or breathing out. Early symptoms of the disease often include a sore throat, headache, a temperature over 38.3C, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours, a fine red rash develops - which feels like sandpaper - and spreads from the stomach and chest to the rest of the body. It can also cause a strawberry red-coloured tongue. Children aged between two and eight are most commonly affected. If your child starts to display any of the signs please take them to see the GP and inform us!
