

Auditing the effectiveness of PE and Sport Funding

Total PE and Sport Funding this academic year: £9275

Brief overview of overall PE and sport provision in the school:

- The school follows a joint curriculum map with another school in our cooperative trust and takes parts in join PE events to celebrate learning and success through the term.
- We have bought into a package of support from a local secondary school which includes access to CPD and competitions.
- Children in Year 5 and 6 have swimming lessons at Dover Leisure Centre.
- We use sports coaches when staff have identified an area of development and teachers team teach with the coaches as a means of CPD.
- After schools sports clubs include: football, table tennis, dance, zumba, sports club.
- We take part in different local sports events including the 'Hythe Round The Houses Run' and District Sports.
- We have a rolling programme of sports roadshows: Paralympics, Jump for Joy, Healthy Lifestyle.
- This year we are working with Premier Sports on The Golden Mile in order to monitor children's fitness levels and identify which children to be targeted to increase their fitness levels and as Gifted and Talented.
- In the run up to next year's Olympics we have launched 'The Road To Rio' where children and their families are trying to cover a distance between them through walking, cycling, scooting etc.

School PE and Sport development priorities based on our school context and identified pupil need:

- To ensure that all children in Year 6 can swim at least 25 metres by the end of the year.
- To identify Gifted and Talented children and signpost them to local clubs (with the support of the sports academy)
- To increase the number of children achieving their Bikeability award
- To make greater use of opportunities for competitive sport.
- To continue to offer CPD through training sessions and team planning and teaching with expert coaches
