### Ear rings in PE / for sporting activities

Sports day was a timely reminder for us all about the wearing of ear-rings during sporting activities. Our school PE policy states that children cannot wear ear-rings during PE lessons for health and safety purposes. Ear-rings cannot be taped up during PE lessons they must be removed. We have based this information from a document called 'Safe practice in PE and school sport' which has been recommended to us by the Local Authority.

Teachers cannot allow children to have ear-rings taped up, or allow children to wear ear-rings during PE lessons. If your child is not confident in removing their own ear-rings please can I ask you to take note of when they have PE (see curriculum overview) and send your child to school without ear-rings on that day?
