#### <u>Useful questions to ask your child when you listen to</u> <u>them read at home</u>

This week the questions below will help enhance your son / daughters understanding of the structure of a fiction / non fiction text (good questions to ask when reading a non fiction text will be written in bold)

- What is the information at the back of the story called?
- Where will you find and index?
- What information will you find in a glossary?
- What information does this diagram tell us?
- Why did the author use arrows / bold writing / underline / colour?
- Which part of the text provides specific details about ...?
- How has the way the title been written encourage you to read it?

Use these questions alongside the ones from last 2 weeks when reading with your son / daughter.
