CPD for PE Leaders	£578	PE leaders will develop a greater awareness of ways to use the PE premium funding to ensure sustainability and long term impact.	This CPD was excellent and has been shared with staff, improving our use of warm ups and ways to ensure children are being active within our PE lessons and developing their fitness and stamina.
