

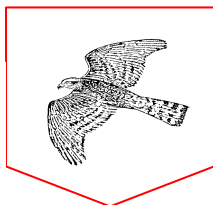

Phonics EYFS / KS1

In term 2 Miss Milborrow lead a couple of workshops for parents – reading in EYFS & KS1 / phonics in EYFS / KS1. I thought as we enter a new term you may like a reminder of the key points from each session – this week phonics.....

Phonics

- * We follow a programme called 'Letters and Sounds'
- * A 'digraph' is a sound made up of 2 letters e.g. ai in rain, sh in shop
- * A 'trigraph' is a sound made up of 3 letters e.g. igh in light, ear in beard
- * We work through 6 phases from Reception to Year 2
- Phase 1-no letter sounds, rhythm, rhyme, alliteration, sound talk
- Phase 2-most single alphabet sounds
- Phase 3-remainder of the alphabet sounds, common digraphs and trigraphs
- Phase 4-no new sounds, building words from consonants (C) and vowels (V) e.g. CVCC, CCVC words
- Phase 5-alternative spellings of sounds and alternative pronunciations of letters
- Phase 6-spelling rules, adding suffixes e.g. –ed, -er, -est
- * Phonics is taught every day in a separate phonics lesson (not as part of the English lesson)
- * Children in Years 1 and 2 are set for phonics, meaning they may have a different teacher to their class teacher

If you have any questions about Phonics or Guided Reading, please speak to your child's class teacher.
