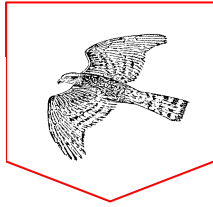


Hawkinge Primary School

Dear Parents,

It has been lovely to see so many parents at our Parents Evenings this week - the children have been very excited to find and read their stickers you have left in the books telling them how proud you are of their work. Many of you (and your children) have said how much you like the 'sticker' idea so this will be something we will be continuing at all Parents Evenings going forward. Thank you for your feedback about this.

Earlier on this year Mrs Bull and a team of teachers submitted an evaluation of our Arts Curriculum to The Arts Council UK. The Arts Council read and analyse our submission and judge the curriculum we deliver at Hawkinge Primary School. If they think our Arts provision is strong they will then award us a bronze, silver or gold accreditation. We have been awarded a Gold accreditation! As you can imagine we are very proud! On the reverse of this week's newsletter I have included some of the feedback they have given us. I am particularly proud of the following statement:

Your children and young people are offered equal opportunity to plan, experience, participate in, and evaluate a broad range of high-quality arts and cultural activities, and you recognise the importance of development opportunities delivered by specialists for your staff that have measurable effects in these areas.

On the 5th February it was 'Internet Safety Day'. At Hawkinge Primary School we talk to children about internet safety all year long.
