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Dear Parents,

It has been wonderful to see so many of you over this week attending Parents Evening appointments. It is so crucial that home and school work hand in hand for the best outcomes for our pupils. I know that the children have really enjoyed looking for their post-it notes you have left in their books praising them for good work. On Tuesday some of our Year 2 pupils represented Hawkinge Primary School at The Three Hills Sports Centre in an Infant Agility competition. They had a great time. Some of the activity leaders commented to Ms Cole (who took the children) about how well children from Hawkinge Primary School behave at these events – including the one on Tuesday, which is always a ‘proud head teacher moment’ for me. The children came in at a very respectable 5th place out of 15 teams.

On a regular basis KCC visit our school to make sure Heidi (our Road Crossing Patrol lady) is doing all she can to make sure the children cross the road safely. Heidi’s assessment came back that she has ‘passed’ with flying colours! However, it was noted that pupils often scoot over the crossing which is not advised. Can I ask you to support Heidi by asking your son / daughter to dismount from their scooter before crossing the road for everyone’s safety please?

I have had a couple of parents ask about when children will be starting back at school in September. We will be having two teacher training days on the 1st and 2nd September so the children will return on Thursday 3rd September 2020. I thought you might like advance knowledge so that you can consider booking a holiday towards the end of the summer break. Please do ensure your children are back at school on Thursday 3rd September. The first two days of the school year are crucial for the children to attend enabling them to re-establish life at school, make new friends and learn more about the school year. On the Thursday and Friday children will participate in team building activities and launch pad activities.
