

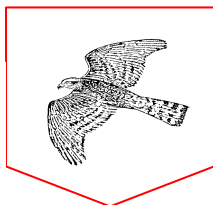

Dear Parents,

Pupils in Year 1 have taken part in the DFE Phonic Screening Assessment this week. I am sure if you have a son / daughter in Y1 they will tell you that they have been doing phonics with Miss Walker / Mrs Rand in the cookery room and not even realise it was a test. Both teachers have reported back to me that the children have tried very hard throughout the assessments. Results will follow shortly after the school reports are distributed.

I am sure you will have received a letter from Mr O'Brien this week to remind you that it is Sports Day on Friday. If your child is in Year 1, 2 or Reception their sports day will begin at 10am. Please come to the car park gate to enter school. The gate will be open at 9:55am. If your child is in Years 3-6 their sports day will begin at 1:20pm. Please come to the car park gate to enter school. The gate will be open at 1:15pm. Please ensure children have their full PE kit at school. During Sports Day please do not give you child drinks / snacks as they go round.

On Friday we are also holding a non-uniform day for the PTFA. On Friday pupils are invited to come to school wearing 'non-uniform clothes' in return for an item for the tombola. The items that are always nice to win on the tombola range from bubble bath, a bottle of wine, tins of food etc. The tombola items will be collected in the Ocean Room next Friday morning. Which leads me to remind you, that it is the PTFA Summer Fair on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> June - please keep the date in your diary free. The summer fair will open at 11am, prior to this the Hawkinge Dance Club (about 10:45am) will perform. The Summer Fair will have a visiting ambulance, BBQ & refreshment stalls, tombola, archery events and bouncy castles. Wristbands will be on sale every morning before and after school next week - £3 in advance and £4 on the day.

Pupils in Year 6 are preparing themselves for their move to their next schools. This week our 'Transition Programme' has started. On a Wednesday the Y6 pupils from Hawkinge Primary School, The Chuirchill School and Selsted School all meet together in the Community Centre in their new school groups. A member of staff from one of the three schools above then leads an hour long session preparing the children for their move to secondary school. It is a great opportunity for children to meet other pupils from different schools in advance of September - so when they start their new school there is not a sea of new faces! They attend 4 transition sessions this term.
